Molesto – annoyed or upset






The boy put on the blindfold and took the stick. But instead of hitting the piñata, he accidentally hit Veronica in the cheek! Veronica began to cry.




Her father quickly picked her up and carried her into the house. He consoled her while he put a band-aid on her cheek. "You'll get a lot of candies!" he told her.
